Cory graduated from Rich Central High School in 1996, received his bachelors degree in
Marketing from St. Xavier University in 2000 and his MBA from University of Illinois,
Chicago (UIC) in 2004. He married the love of his life, Melissa (Morris) Cooper on May 17,
2013.

From an early age Cory excelled at sports, trying everything from baseball, football and even a little gymnastics, but his passion lied on the Basketball Court. He was a member of the Rich Central Varsity basketball team that won the SICA South Championship in 1996.
